Her style represents a link with the older generation of ballad singers and today she is one of the most respected singers and teachers of traditional song in Scotland. She helped form and led Eurydice, the women's choir, for 17 years and teaches traditional song for the Royal Scottish Academy.

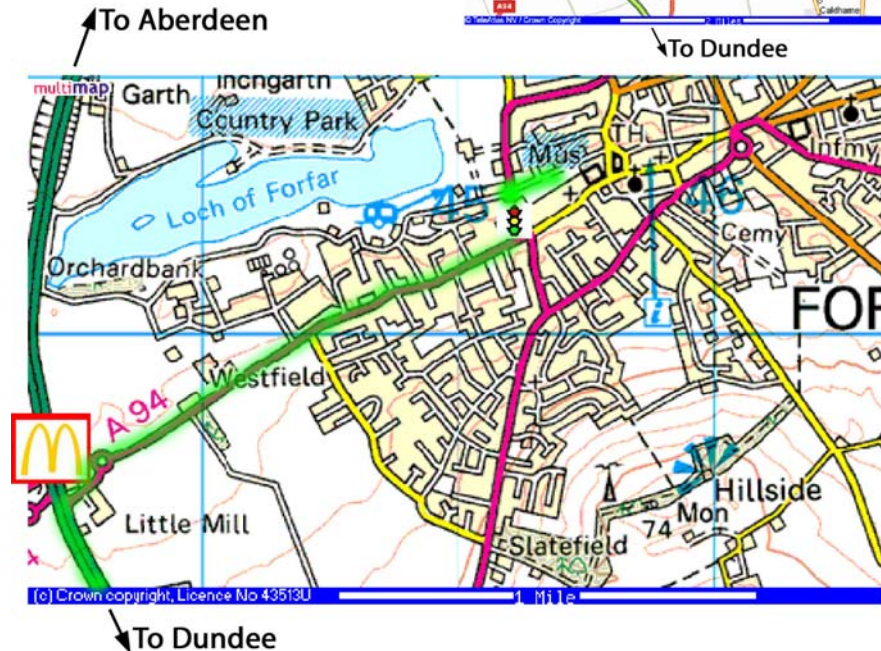
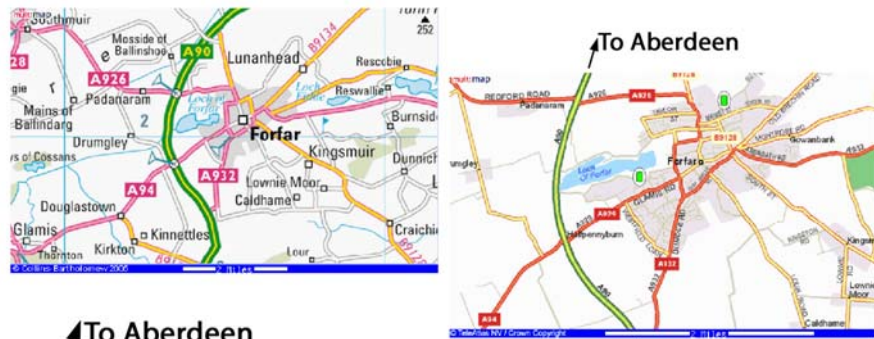

There is a McDonalds

Follow Glamis Road
straight in to the town
until you reach the
traffic lights at the end
of West High Street.



St. Margaret's Church is straight ahead over these lights, on the left, between the bank and the post office. However, to park your car, turn left at the traffic lights and the first right, signposted for the Myre Car Park. This is a free car park and you can lave your car all day. From the car park, a small lane / steps leads up the side of the Guide Hall to St. Margaret's Church. At the top of the steps, opposite the postal depot, the entrance to the church hall is the first gate on your right.
